Rocket Mail

A. J. de Bruijn was a dental technician from Amsterdam who used most of his spare time and a lot of his money on rocket experiments. He sold rocket mail to defray some of the high costs of his hobby. The first mail was flown in 1936, from Ijsselmonde (near Rotterdam). In the thirty years de Bruijn experimented (aside from the war years) he and his co-workers, members of the Nederlandse Ruimtevaart Studio (Dutch Space Flight Studio), launched 81 mail rockets in the Netherlands, 9 in Italy, 8 in Belgium, 5 in Luxembourg and 5 in Germany. The rockets could travel 20 km or more. De Bruijn made an important contribution to the development of rocket mail.

Scout Rocket Mail in Belgium, 1960

The term *Scout Rocket Mail* is used to describe rocket mail associated with Scouting. Nederlandse Ruimtevaart Studio launched two mail rockets on 27 April 1960 in commemoration of the Golden Jubilee of US Scouting. Special rocket cachets identify mail from the rockets 'Daniel Beard' and 'Baden Powell II', respectively. Flown covers carry a bi-coloured locally printed rocket mail stamp. The stamps were issued imperforate and perforated in sheets of four. Special astrograms were also produced; the rocket equivalent of aerograms or air letters.

Rocket Baden Powell II

Named after Lord Baden-Powell of Gilwell (1857-1941), founder of the Scout Movement.

Rocket Daniel Beard

Named after Daniel Carter "Uncle Dan" Beard (1850-1941), an American illustrator, author, youth leader, and social reformer who founded the Sons of Daniel Boone in 1905. Beard merged his organization into the Boy Scouts of America when it was founded in 1910. He later became editor of Boys' Life magazine, the BSA official magazine.



A brown and red bi-coloured rocket mail stamp was produced locally.

The sheets of Scout rocket stamps were printed se-tenant with similar sheets for a flight commemorating the VIII Winter Olympics. The Olympic rocket flight took place on the same day as the Scout rockets.



A brown and red bi-coloured rocket mail stamp was produced locally. The stamps were issued imperforate and perforated in sheets of four.












